COLORADO MANDATORY DISCLOSURE STATEMENT

Education and Experience

Kent W. Nixon received his New Mexico Doctor of Oriental Medicine licensure in June of 2005. This licensure required first passing the national acupuncture and herbology licensing boards put forth by the NCCAOM making Kent a Diplomate in Oriental Medicine. Then the state of New Mexico has it's own acupuncture test, which Kent passed, allowing him to become a primary care physician in New Mexico. His Master of Science in Oriental Medicine degree, which he received in 2003, comes from the International Institute of Chinese Medicine in Santa Fe, New Mexico. He has also received his Bachelors degree in Psychology from Colorado State University in 1998.

After schooling Kent continued his studies by participating in and then helping proctor two seminar series taught by Sensei Koei Kuahara, a master in Hari, a Japanese system of acupuncture also known as Japanese Meridian Therapy. He received his certificate to practice Japanese Hari Acupuncture in 2004.

After licensure in New Mexico Kent and four other Hari practitioners started a non-profit organization named Community Acupuncture Project which brought free acupuncture to low-income persons in Santa Fe.

In 2006, Kent moved to back to Fort Collins to open Old Town Acupuncture. Kent has and continues to maintain all licensing, registrations, and memberships current and in good standing with the State of Colorado. None of these licenses, certificates, or memberships have ever been suspended or revoked.

Note

Kent's training includes Acupuncture, Chinese Herbology and related modalities such as moxibustion, tuina, acupressure, cupping, guasha, auriculotherapy, craniosacral therapy, and dietary and lifestyle recommendations.

This clinic complies with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Colorado Department of Health, including the proper cleaning and sterilization of needles and the sanitation of acupuncture offices. All acupuncture needles are of the factory-sterilized disposable type, never used more than once, and then disposed of in approved sharps containers that are picked up by an approved hazardous waste service.
